WI WINS Updates

Our Alliance partners with WI WINS to use positive reinforcement to create healthier communities by congratulating clerks who don't sell tobacco to youth and educating those who do.

Currently our county partners are working on:

- Conducting local tobacco compliance checks
- Media outreach
- Public outreach around T-21 and other tobacco prevention information.

More than 3 Million Youth Report Using a Tobacco Product in 2022

On November 10th, 2022, a study was released by the FDA and CDC that found 3 million US middle and high school students reported current use of any tobacco product in 2022. These findings included about 2.5 million high school students and 530,000 middle school students.

This report found that e-cigarettes were the most commonly used device for the ninth consecutive year in a row among all students. They were then followed by cigars, cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, hookah, and several other tobacco products. This report specifically only collected information on commercial tobacco products and not the use of sacred or traditional tobacco.

Among all race and ethnicity groups within this study it was found that , non-Hispanic American Indian or Alaska Native students had the highest percentage of any tobacco product use. The study also showed that non-Hispanic students had the highest reported percentage of ecigarette use. The results also found other groups that reported higher rates of tobacco use, including those with grades of mostly F's, students with sever symptoms of psychological distress, LGBTQIA+ students and those with low family affluence.

The findings of this study suggest that many factors contribute to youth tobacco use, including flavors, marketing and misperceptions of harm. They also found continuing disparities in tobacco use due to an increased exposure to tobacco promotions in racial and ethnic minority communities.

FDA Warns Firms for Selling Illegal E-Cigarettes That Look Like Toys, Food, and Cartoon Characters



On November 16th, 2022, the FDA issued warning letters to five firms for the unauthorized marketing of 15 e-cigarette products. All the firms that were issued warnings failed to submit premarket applications for all these unauthorized products. The products that were issued warnings had packaging that looked like toys, food, or cartoon characters which are likely to promote youth use.

These products included similarities to glow sticks, Nintendo Game Boys, and walkie-talkies and included characters from TV shows and movies. Such as The Simpsons, Family Guy, Squid Game, Rick and Morty, Minions, and Baby Bus.

The companies charged for these products were Wizman Limited business and Wizvapor, Shenzhen Fumot Technology Co. Ltd. doing business as R and M Vaps, Shenzhen Quawins Technology Co., Ltd., Ruthless Vapor, and Moti Global. The warning letters notified these companies that e-cigarettes without a marketing authorization order are "adulterated and misbranded and that selling these products in the U.S. is prohibited. If these companies fail to correct these violations, the FDA will take further action.
